Does everyone know we have a website www.projectlinusfrederickmd.org that provides information on our blanket specifications along with our drop-off sites, agencies we serve and letters from thankful recipients of our blankets along with many other facts about our chapter? It contains information that is not always on Facebook.



Who are some of the agencies we service?

We have 3 all in the same place, which is Frederick Memorial Hospital (FMH).

Blankets are distributed in 3 main areas, others if needed, within the hospital and they are:

- *Pediatric Unit* is an Inpatient Unit that cares for those who are ages 0-18.
- *Pediatric Emergency Department* is an Outpatient Unit that cares for those who present to the regular Emergency Department, but since they are between the ages of 0-18, are transferred here.
- *Forensic Assessment & Clinical Services (FACS) Clinic* - this is a newer unit within the hospital that cares for all ages and individuals of assault, human trafficking and sexual abuse. They work in conjunction with Child Advocacy Center (also an agency we service).

We are excited to announce that our Chapter, with the assistance of *Patches* Quilt Shop of Mt. Airy, is going to provide the blankets to the participants of Camp Jamie this year.

What is Camp Jamie? It's a program through Hospice of Frederick County, held May 31 through June 2, that provides a special opportunity for grieving children and adolescents to come together to talk about their feelings related to the death of someone special, and learn coping skills for dealing with those feelings.

The camp is held twice a year and provides unique opportunities to express and communicate grief in a healthy and safe environment with bereavement counselors, specially trained volunteers and psychologists. Children are paired with a big buddy when they arrive to provide companionship, support, friendship and lots of individualized attention.
